Or 'Coenhelm's cott', Anglo-Saxon,
first recorded in the 13th century

BRIEF HISTORY OF KELMSCOTT MANOR

- Built around 1600 by Thomas Turner, farmer
- William Morris's summer retreat from 1871
- Pre-Raphaelite artist Dante Gabriel Rossetti was co-tenant 1871-74
- William Morris died 1896
- Jane Morris bought the Manor and estate in 1913, shortly before her death in 1914
- Lived in and loved by members of the Morris family until 1938 (when May Morris died)
- Owned by University of Oxford 1939-1962
- Owned by Society of Antiquaries of London since 1962
